President's Message

2023 was a banner year for the St. Iakovos Retreat Center! Thank you for your gifts, prayers, support, and advocacy in promoting our mission and guest stays.

The St. Iakovos Retreat Center hosted 2,578 guests in 2023. Of that total, 1,694 people were part of Metropolis-related events, with 952 people from Fanari Camps. The total number of groups visiting us in 2023 was 45. This represents a growth of 7.4% over last year in the number of people served, and 66.7% growth in the number of groups coming onto our campus.

The Retreat Center installed the personally inscribed brick pavers made possible by our donors as part of our 15th Anniversary recognition and celebration. The chapel patio and cottage sidewalk are the locations of our first installments. They beautify and personalize our "home" on the campus.



Among several firsts, we received our first endowment, held our first concert event fundraiser with a sold-out show, and supportive sponsorships. Our first Women's Advocacy Group was initiated. They have written their mission statement, held their first event, and gathered for their first official volunteer event to decorate the main lodge for the holidays. We received several naming opportunities this past year and welcomed two new board members.

We are grateful for your faithful support. Your gifts have made a difference in the lives of children and adults, bearing witness to our faith, and sharing love and hospitality with the people we serve. Welcome to 2024 and the first edition for our new look! The bible verse reminds us all to not only live well ourselves, but to always strive to help others to live well through faith, hospitality, service and community.


